About the course

The **Adolescent Medicine 2018** course is designed to present the latest research, clinical innovations and community initiatives in adolescent medicine to physicians, nurse practitioners, and other health professionals involved in the medical care of adolescents and young adults.

The dynamic learning format of the program aims to provide attendees with tangible knowledge about the diagnosis and management of a wide variety of adolescent medical, emotional and social problems that are then transferable to their office practice. Over the course of three days, registrants will attend lectures, Q&A sessions, panel presentations, and workshops. Learning objectives

Upon completion of this course, participants will be able to:

- › Integrate findings from research and clinical innovations with the delivery of adolescent patient-centered care.
- › Apply the principles of quality improvement, addressing systems and practice issues, into clinical activities.
- › Model communication skills with adolescents and their families.
- › Identify the newest recommendations for topics such as adolescent vaccinations and TB testing, PREP, nPEP, lipid screening and treatment of ARFID.

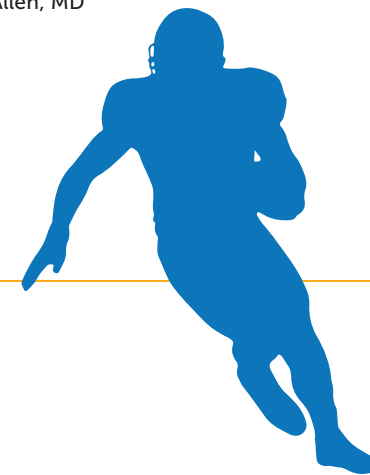

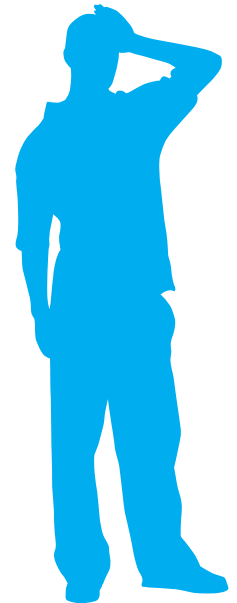
