Course Description

This course is designed to meet the physicians', physician assistants', nurse practitioners', nurses' and other health care providers' need for enhanced knowledge and competence and improved performance in caring for patients with common surgical problems in multiple pediatric surgical subspecialties. It is designed to address the common issues seen by the practicing pediatrician, physician assistant, nurse practitioner and/or nurse in their daily practice. It allows the attendee to enhance his/her ability to make a surgical diagnosis, enhance their initial screening process; and increase their knowledge of when to refer to a specialist.
